Gentlemen:

Thank you for your letter dated March 24, 1966.

In this connection we are pleased to enclose herewith two copies of the Charter of the League of Arab States.

The Arab Information Center was established according to a decision taken by the Council of the League of Arab States on May 10, 1953.

The principals of the Arab Information Center are the Governments of: Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon, Morocco, Sudan, Saudi Arabia, Tunisia, United Arab Republic, Yemen Arab Republic, Algeria, Syrian Arab Republic, State of Kuwait, and Kingdom of Libya.

The Arab Information Center serves as an information office of the above-named governments to increase understanding between the American and the Arab peoples. It also serves to further the common interest and peaceful development with regard to trade, religious and cultural exchange, and tourism. The office acts to make information with respect to the Arab world available in the United States. Its activities are carried out by its staff members, who give lectures to groups requesting them; appear on radio and TV programs; answer information requests received by mail, telephone, and in personal visits to the office; write letters to newspaper editors; show available films on the culture and development of the Arab world; and distribute publications which serve the aims described above.

These funds are considered yearly and approved by the Council of the League of Arab States at its regular annual meetings. The amounts received are itemized under Item 10 in the supplemental Registration Statement which is filed with the Department of Justice every six months.
